



Green School Course Syllabus

Course Information

Curriculum is created by a statewide team and coordinated locally to be offered in communities across Colorado. Course content is developed using research- and evidenced-based horticultural information approved by Colorado State University. Course format may vary by region and county. All students will take online classes as part of their curriculum, utilizing Colorado State University Online's platform called Canvas, and utilize Zoom for live courses and weekly reviews.

Course Objective

The purpose of Green School training is to teach interested participants in relevant, evidenced- and science-based horticultural information specific to our regions in Colorado.

Course Materials

GardenNotes is your online reference 'textbook' and curriculum for this course. *There is no hardcopy version available.* Access *GardenNotes* online at ColoradoMasterGardener.org > Volunteer Resources > *GardenNotes*.

- **READINGS:** The *GardenNotes* readings are not required. Rather, these serve as reference material and a supplement to your online and webinar courses.
- **HOMEWORK:** The homework and worksheets are optional but are there to enhance your learning. Some of these worksheets/homework will be used for activities in the weekly live reviews, but not all. If you have questions on the material in these worksheets – please contact the instructor for that subject.
- **RESOURCES TO STAY ORGANIZED:** See the *Reading, Homework and Worksheet List* for more detailed information for each class. The *Student Training Guide* is a printable week-by-week guide that may be useful for taking notes and staying organized.
- **TECHNOLOGY:** You will need access to a laptop or desktop computer, updated internet browser software (multiple browsers work well with Canvas, EXCEPT Internet Explorer), and reliable internet access.

Instructional Methods

This course utilizes self-paced online courses, live (& recorded) courses and weekly reviews for multi-modal adult learning and flexibility to meet your scheduling needs.

- **ONLINE COURSES:** All students will have access to online classes offered through CSU Online's **Canvas** platform. To gain access to these courses, you'll need to register using a link provided by CSU. **Instructions for registering and links to Canvas will be emailed to you the first week of classes.** Once you have access to Canvas, you can always find a link to login on the GardenNotes webpage.
- **WEEKLY LIVE REVIEWS:** Each week you have an online class, you'll join a weekly "Live Review" webinar session. These reviews are subject-matter specific (based on the topic you studied online) and will be facilitated by a CSU faculty or staff specialist. These serve as your best change to get live questions answered, hear the latest on the topic and enhance your learning by interacting with CSU Horticulture experts. *These will be recorded and posted on Canvas if you cannot attend live.*
- **RECORDED CLASSES WITH LIVE Q&A:** Two classes are only offered via recorded lectures, with a live lunch hour Q&A: Colorado Gardening Challenges and Plant Pathology. Attendance is strongly encouraged – you won't want to miss a chance to ask CSU content experts your questions and hear what your fellow classmates are thinking! A recording will be posted in Canvas the week after the live Q&A. *There is a post-test in Canvas for each.*

Course Policies

Follow your course schedule for class dates and online class deadlines. **The final exam opens on 3/31/22.** To **earn a printed and mail certificate, you must complete all course requirements by 4/30/22.** If you complete after this date, you'll need to notify us at GreenSchool@colostate.edu and we'll email you a certificate.

Earning Your Certificate

Earning a certificate is optional. You can attend Green School without earning your certificate.

To obtain certification, trainees must:

- Complete 7 online classes and take the online post-test for each class
- Watch the recording for the 2 classes with a live Q&A and attend (or watch the recording of) the lunch hour Q&A sessions; take an online post-test for each class
- Pass the comprehensive final (open-book, research encouraged) with a 70% or better by the due date posted in your schedule
- Note: *Your score for pre- and post-tests do not affect your grade, only your final exam score and attendance determines passing.*

Upon completion of the certificate requirements, you'll receive a **Colorado Gardener Certificate**. The Colorado Gardener Certificate may be displayed in a place of business and used in business marketing.

Can you Become a Master Gardener after Green School?

Certificate students will take courses alongside Colorado Master Gardener Apprentices. These are individuals who have applied and completed program requirements to serve as authorized CSU volunteers locally following Green School training. However, because there is no subsequent volunteer commitment, *participants do not become Colorado Master Gardeners.* The title of 'Master Gardener' is a registered service mark and only to be used for CSU Extension events and purposes. If you choose to apply and are accepted locally to a Colorado Master Gardener program, your Green School training will count towards your Master Gardener training as long as it is within 3 years from completion.
