

Green School Course Syllabus

Course Information

Curriculum is created by a statewide team and coordinated locally to be offered in communities across Colorado. Course content is developed using research- and evidenced-based horticultural information approved by Colorado State University. All students will take online classes as part of their curriculum, utilizing Colorado State University Online's platform called Canvas, and utilize Zoom for live courses and weekly reviews.

Course Instruction

Your best point of contact for questions and information is the State Green Team GreenSchool@colostate.edu and any class instructors listed in Canvas. This is a team of CSU Horticulture faculty and staff that are ready to support you.

Course Objective

The purpose of Green School training is to teach interested participants in relevant, evidenced- and science-based horticultural information specific to our regions in Colorado.

Course Materials

GardenNotes is your online reference 'textbook' and curriculum for this course. There is no hardcopy version available. Access GardenNotes online at http://coloradoMasterGardener.org > Green School > GardenNotes.

- ➤ **READINGS:** The GardenNotes readings are not required. Rather, these serve as reference material and a supplement to your online and webinar courses. Most of the online courses include this text in the curriculum. You are welcome to print GardenNotes as needed for your own learning.
- ➤ **HOMEWORK:** The homework and worksheets are **optional** but are there to enhance your learning. Some of these worksheets/homework will be used for activities in the weekly live reviews, but not all. If you have questions on the material in these worksheets please contact the instructor for that subject.
- ➤ **RESOURCES TO STAY ORGANIZED:** See the *Reading, Homework and Worksheet List* for more detailed information for each class. The *Student Training Guide* is a printable week-by-week optional guide that may be useful for taking notes and staying organized.
- ➤ **TECHNOLOGY:** You will need access to a laptop or desktop computer, **updated internet browser software** (multiple browsers work well with Canvas, EXCEPT Internet Explorer), and reliable internet access.

Instructional Methods

This course utilizes self-paced online courses, live & recorded sessions and weekly reviews for multi-



modal adult learning and flexibility to meet your scheduling needs.

- ➤ ONLINE COURSES: All students will have access to online classes offered through CSU Online's Canvas platform. When you register for Green School, you will be emailed credentials to login to Canvas. Course access opens November 4th, 2024 and allows time for you to orient yourself to the platform during week one.
- ➤ WEEKLY LIVE REVIEWS: Each week of class, we offer a weekly "Live Review" webinar session. These reviews are subject-matter specific (based on the topic you studied online) and will be facilitated by a CSU faculty or staff specialist. These serve as your best chance to get live questions answered, hear the latest on the topic and enhance your learning by interacting with CSU Horticulture experts. Typically, you only need to attend ONE live review as the content is the same on Wednesday evenings and Thursday mornings. These will be recorded and posted in Canvas along with a comprehensive Q&A guide. You are encouraged but not required to attend we do not take attendance.

Course Policies

Follow your course schedule for class dates and online class deadlines. The final exam opens on 3/1/2025. To earn a printed and mail certificate, you must complete all course requirements by 3/31/2025. If you complete after this date, you'll need to notify us at GreenSchool@colostate.edu and we'll email you a certificate.

Earning Your Certificate

Earning a certificate is <u>optional</u>. You can attend Green School without earning your certificate. To obtain certification, trainees must:

- Complete 8 online classes (indicated by completing the online guiz after each class)
- Pass the comprehensive final (open-book, research encouraged) with a 70% or better by the due date posted in the schedule
- Note: Your score for the quizzes does not affect your grade, only your final exam score and online class completion determines passing.

Upon completion of the certificate requirements, you'll receive a **Colorado Gardener Certificate**. The Colorado Gardener Certificate may be displayed in a place of business and used in business marketing.

Can you Become a Master Gardener after Green School?

Certificate students will take courses alongside Colorado State Extension Master Gardener Apprentices. These are individuals who have applied and completed program requirements to serve as authorized CSU volunteers locally following Green School training. However, because there is no subsequent volunteer commitment, *participants do not become Colorado State Extension Master Gardeners*. The title of 'Colorado State Extension Master Gardener' is a federally registered trademark of Colorado State University and only to be used for CSU Extension events and purposes. If you choose to apply and are accepted locally to a Colorado Master Gardener program, your Green School training will count towards your Master Gardener training as long as its within 3 years from completion.

Course Evaluation

You will be sent a course evaluation in April to get your feedback.
